At MARL, we don't just put a cat in a cage and call it good. Our feline residents enjoy a variety of enrichment activities to relieve stress and make the shelter a fun place to be while waiting for forever homes. Whether they're chasing laser pointers, playing with bubbles, or snuggling on laps, the cats and kittens at MARL get plenty of exercise time, playtime, and quality time with people who love them.





TEAMWORK MAKES THE **DREAM WORK**

While our staff provides the oversight, our incredible team of cat volunteers are the heart and soul of our cat care program. These dedicated folks cover shifts between the hours of 8am and 6pm, seven days a week, 365 days a year. Our cat volunteer team assists with cleaning, feeding, socializing, and everything in between. They are an essential part of our cat's lives and we couldn't provide the level of care MARL is known for to as many cats as we do without their support.





FELINE FREESTYLE

MARL's cage-free cat room is a fun and unique housing option for adoptable feline residents that enjoy the company of other cats. This room houses up to 15 cats at any given time and allows them to roam freely 24/7, with plenty of opportunities to climb, perch, run, play, and nap in sunny spots to their heart's content.

FAITH'S STORY

Faith and her puppies found themselves in MARL's care on August 31, 2023. Her puppies arrived in a laundry hamper, covered in dirt and fleas. They were in deplorable condition and initially appeared lifeless. Our medical team jumped into action, providing them with immediate life-saving care. It took our team hours to provide baths, food, and fluids to all seven puppies.

Their surrenderer informed our team that Faith had her puppies in a backyard and was living underneath a deck. Not only was Faith emaciated, but she also tested positive for Heartworm Disease. Despite her rough past, Faith's spirit remained unbroken. She trusted our team and was grateful for all the care and TLC she was receiving.

Faith was a wonderful mom and just a few short months after her arrival, one by one, all her puppies walked out the door with their new families. While Faith was eager and ready to find a home of her own, she was still nervous with new people and unsure of how to be a dog. Slowly and surely, she began to show the same trust for our volunteer team as she had for the MARL staff. It didn't take long before she became an avid greeter at the door of her kennel whenever a new face walked by and quickly became the star of every dog playgroup. Faith developed a love for toys, being tucked in at night, and spending quiet time with people. Her journey from intake to adoption was remarkable, a true testament of how "the quality of the wait" can make all the difference in the future of an animal.

After 162 days in MARL's care, Faith found her perfect match. We are happy to report that Faith wasted no time making herself at home and is already incredibly loved and spoiled, our wish for every MARL animal.

MARL's mission is to help all of our dogs and cats feel as comfortable as they can as soon as they set foot in our building, and it doesn't stop there. By making individualized behavioral plans for every animal using enrichment, outings, training, playgroups with other animals, quiet time, and more, we help each animal become happy, healthy, and the most confident they can be before adoption."

MARL'S MEDICAL TEAM

Every animal that arrives at MARL requires some sort of medical care. From routine vaccinations, exams, and preventative care, to radiographs, bloodwork, and specialized surgery, MARL's medical team provides every dog and cat with exactly what they need to get back on their feet and ready for adoption.

Over one third of MARL's 15,000 square foot facility is dedicated to the veterinary care of our residents. The medical wing features a surgery suite, exam rooms, important diagnostic equipment, an x-ray machine, and plenty of custom animal housing designed to reduce the spread of disease. This upgrade from our previous facility has provided our team with a space that finally matches the level of care happening within its walls.

While our incredible facility plays a crucial role in the quality of care we are able to provide, it is our hardworking and dedicated medical team that makes all the difference. Our medical program is overseen by Dr. Rick Tully, with support from Dr. Bryan Cornwall, Dr. Pierre DePorre, and Dr. Deb DePorre. Our Medical Care Supervisor, Stefany, oversees the daily operations in our medical department, ensuring that each animal receives the compassion, care and support they need during their stay at the shelter.

It is a culmination of donations, support from our community, our state-of-the-art facility, and our incredible medical team that allows MARL to accept and provide a lifeline to even the most vulnerable dogs and cats.



"We have numerous situations where we've had animals come in that look like they might not make it to the next day. And then, through the care of these special people, things start to work out. This is a volunteer position and I get paid more than anyone in the state because I get to see that. The ladies and gentlemen that I work with here, come here because it is so rewarding. The animals are really lucky to be here. Many of them have been in more than one situation, some worse than others, but once they get here, everything changes."








MARL's enrichment program is just one of the many ways we strive to give our dogs the best "quality of the wait".
